

The **ROTARIAN CODE OF CONDUCT** (formerly known as the Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions) provides a framework for ethical behavior that all Rotarians can use, together with the Four-Way Test, in their business and professional activities.

Rotarian Code of Conduct

AS A ROTARIAN, I will

- 1) Act with integrity and high ethical standards in my personal and professional life
- 2) Deal fairly with others and treat them and their occupations with respect
- 3) Use my professional skills through Rotary to mentor young people, help those with special needs, and improve people's quality of life in my community and in the world
- 4) Avoid behavior that reflects adversely on Rotary or other Rotarians
- 5) Not seek special business or professional advantages from other Rotarians

The Object of Rotary

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

An excellent program was presented about the Northeast Metro 916 School District. Northeast Metro 916 is one of four intermediate school districts in Minnesota, offering specialized and shared programming that includes career and technical education, special education services, area learning centers, and care and treatment. Northeast Metro 916 provides cost-effective and expert services to the 14 member school districts that make up Northeast Metro. The services range from K-12. There are 700 staff members who served approximately 6,000 students last year. Services are provided at the various member districts or at the 3 new Northeast Metro facilities located in Blaine, Lake Elmo and Little Canada. Last year they had \$68.1 million revenues with most coming from tuition, non-district member access fees and membership fees. The 14 member school districts are Centennial, Columbia Heights, Forest Lake, Fridley, Mahtomedi, Mounds View, North St. Paul-Maplewood, Roseville, South Washington County, Spring Lake Park, St. Anthony-New Brighton, St. Francis, Stillwater, and White Bear Lake. 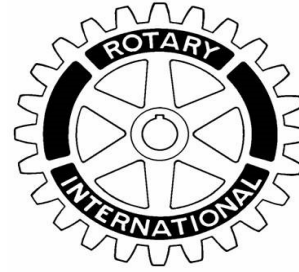

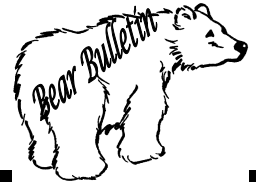
