Russian Open World

Rotary has hosted eight different Open World delegations over a 10-year period. Now Rotary is hosting its fourth delegation with a special education focus.

Greg Bartz reviewed the trip itinerary and highlights thus far and then each delegation member spoke. Tatyana Vladimirovna Zadorozhnaya--Works at Regional Center for psychological, medical and social support as a speech teacher. She is also a master student studying the subject of health in children with complex disorders. She works with children of all ages and shared slides of her work.

Marina Alekseyevna Melnikova--For the last 10 years she has worked at a rehab center for children with disabilities and special needs. The name of the organization translates into Rainbow. Their mission is to help children attain the most normal quality of life possible. Every year the center is visited by over 700 children with a variety of needs. As deputy director for rehabilitation she coordinates activities and works with her staff to implement innovative technologies in working with children with disabilities. She writes job descriptions for the specialists, makes sure her education is updated continually, and handles center paperwork. She is very grateful to Rotary for the Open World learning opportunity and knows that what she has learned will help improve her work.

Anna Vladimirovna Medvedkova—She is a civil engineer by education working at preserving cultural history. She loves biking, private aviation and motorcycles. Anna bikes year round, loves making toys for children, items for dog-sledding, covers for boats, etc. She is a member of Rotarac (one of only six clubs in the district) working on a social entrepreneur project where they sell toys and other items. She presented a set of post cards with the different projects they have done.

Yekaterina Aleksandrovna Bezuglova--Back in 2014, her colleagues visited Minnesota and brought back tools to help children on the autistic spectrum. Right now she works at regional center for children who need psychological and medical help. In 2010 they had only 2-3 children, in 2014 they have 26 thanks to a pilot project and learning the need to provide broader support to children and families. This project has been going on 1 ½ years and the collaboration with other organizations improves outcomes along with staff education. Thank you to Rotary for this opportunity. Visiting schools has provided invaluable experience.

Tatyana Semenovna Antonova is a special education teacher working in a boarding school. In addition, she works at the university as a teacher which helps her regularly upgrade her skills and knowledge. She started working with orphans but now works with children with a variety of needs. She upgraded her skills to work as a behavioral therapist. Tatyana shared a video of her work with various students. She also noted how American families had adopted several of the orphans but was saddened that this practice is no longer in operation.

Artem Viktorovich Martynov--Works as an engineer in heating, ventilating and air conditioning. His hobbies include theater acting, hiking including the Pillars (eighth wonder of the world), running club, half-marathons, drawing in photoshop (pop art). He invited members to visit and hike the Pillars. As a Rotaract member, he came her on a social project called The Kind Store (selling art work and handiwork produced by orphans and getting the money back to them).

The group thanked Rotary for their smiles and friendship and noted that what they have learned will help them in their work in Russia. They were also very grateful to the host families and ended by singing a song wishing happiness in all our homes.
