PROGRAM: Jeff Otto presents: Mark Stutrud, Summit Brewing

Mark is a Wahpeton, ND native and the founder and President of Summit Brewing. The brewery started on University Ave. in St. Paul and now works out of a state-ofthe-art facility at 35E and West 7th St. He began his work life as a social worker helping among others, those with addictions. He rose to the mid-management level in the St. Mary's Hospital organization until his duties mounted to a level that made it difficult for him to make a difference. He'd had an interest in making beer, but was naïve about brewing. In 1982, while still at the hospital, he started researching the nine existing microbreweries in existence at the time. Breweries in Seattle and Albany, NY were most instrumental in him following his dream of making beer, which began in 1984. Financing was an issue so Jerry Mogul (sp) from Gold Medal bottling taught him the fine art of the cold call. It took 1,500 calls to get 600 appointments resulting in his first 20 investors. In 1986 Summit began selling Extra Pale Ale by self distributing because no distributor would touch Summit. The typical beer was brewed to not offend anybody's taste buds for mass appeal. Although, he chooses not to denigrate the companies that brew light domestic lagers (characterized as bunny-whizz, by Mark), Summit EPA has a taste profile that does not fit that mold. Mark is of the opinion that it is harder to brew a good glass of beer than to make a good bottle of wine. Consistency in the light of good and bad years for barley, hops, and yeast is not easy. Summit, and the now 5,000 microbreweries in the US does not represent a trend, but a return to regionalism. Mark invited everyone down to do a tour of the Summit facility to sample some of the new beers.
