Mike attended Carleton College in Northfield and graduated in 1970 with a B.A.
in history, an educator's license and an eagerness to teach young minds. After
studying abroad for part of his college studies, Lovett was offered a teaching job
in Smithtown, N.Y. He completed both his master's degree and his Ph.D. studies
at the University of Minnesota. In 1979, he began work at the Minnesota Depart-
ment of Education, where he would remain for five years. Lovett became the as-
sistant superintendent for instruction in human resources for the Minnetonka
Public Schools in 1988. “I was in Minnetonka for 20 years,” Lovett says. Lovett
and his wife raised four children, who graduated from the Minnetonka public
school system. Then, on July 1, 2008, I came to White Bear Lake as school su-
perintendent,” Lovett says. He and his wife made the move to White Bear Lake
because, as he puts it, “it's important for a school superintendent to live in the
community where he is working.” He retired from the job in 2017. Amidst vari-
ous community and nonprofit endeavors, he today teaches graduate students at
the U of M.

Mike has been a great Rotarian and dedicated to our community.

improvisation, and hope. He has found that the time created new opportunities

**Jim Hunt announced: Rancho Quemado Water Project Reaches Comple-
tion.** The White Bear lead District Grant project to provide water storage and
distribution to this small village on the Osa Peninsula in far SW Costa Rica is
finished. The \$16,000 grant provided two—22,000 liter tanks and two distribu-
tion lines. This provided water to 90 families, for many the first running water
in their homes, along with several community buildings. Thanks goes out to
White Bear and the other four district clubs that supported this project.

Water Gremlin Company was founded in 1949, in White Bear Lake, Minnesota as a supplier of innovative products to the recreational fishing markets. Initial products included fishing lures and lead sinkers. Our manufacturing scope broadened in the 1970s to include industry-leading terminals for lead-acid batteries.

We currently have over 160,000 square feet of combined manufacturing and warehousing space in Minnesota. We are the leading supplier of battery terminals to the North and South American battery markets, as well as other markets throughout the world.

They have been a long standing member of the business community in WBL. In recent times, they were cited for water pollution violations, and have been working with the State and various parties to resolve the issues, and remediate. Water Gremlin and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) have signed a stipulation agreement that resolves alleged hazardous waste and stormwater issues identified during previous inspections.

The White Bear Township company is required to implement rigorous training and safeguards to prevent further contamination, as well as pay a \$325,000 civil penalty. Noted in the agreement is Water Gremlin’s completion of 31 corrective actions regarding its handling and management of lead, lead-contaminated hazardous waste, TCE-contaminated hazardous waste, used oil and used oil-contaminated materials. In a press release of its own, Water Gremlin maintained it has been voluntarily cooperating with county and state authorities to make improvements in facilities and processes for its handling of hazardous waste materials. Scott provided comments that his company is doing all required and going further to ensure safety.
