Program: St. Paul Saints, Tom Whaley.

Jim Rathburn introduced St. Paul Saints' executive vice president Tom Whaley. A Lino Lakes resident, Tom has been associated with the Saints for many years. The team got its start in 1993 as part of the northern league stretching from Madison, WI to Billings, MT and down to Iowa. No one really thought it would succeed without Major League dollars, but it has, Tom said.

Independent league baseball exists to win games and championships. It also provides a second chance for players. There are now 50-60 independent teams around the nation. Last year they sold six contracts back into affiliated baseball, which shows how these leagues develop players.

On the marketing level, the Saints are known for silly promotions. Tom says they often "shoot first and ask questions later." Last year the Saints did win the league championship (it had been 15 years since their last championship). And they held had a one block, one minute parade to celebrate.

"It's about the fans having fun," Tom noted, adding that 10-20 percent of the fans are there for baseball, but 80-90 percent are there just to have fun. Co-owner Mike Veeck's most prominent philosophies are: It's all about the fans; Be accessible; and Have fun with it. Veeck owns the team along with attorney Marv Goldklang and actor/comedian Bill Murray.

The Saints started at Midway Stadium and moved to CHS Field in 2015 when the stadium opened. The move was due to infrastructure issues at Midway. The stadium is owned by the City of Saint Paul and seats 7,210.

An outdoor season is defined as about 208 days. For CHS field, the Saints play about 50 home games and there are about 100 amateur games scheduled on the field. Those games include Hamline University (CHS is their home field), high school games, legion baseball and more.

The Saints mascot is a pig. They only use male pigs because they are easier to train, Tom noted. Each year it's a new pig and a new name (Saints Name the Pig Contest) reflecting pop culture. The pig delivers baseballs to the home plate umpire, entertains the crowd, and poses for photos. The mascot starts out as a 20 pound piglet and by the end of the season is retired at about 200 pounds.

The Saints also have a number of ushertainers including Mudonna (two legged furry mascot), Gert the Flirt, Pig's Eye Pete and more. Sister Roz provides healing massages to fans.

They always have to come up with big ideas (promotions) to draw fans to CHS Field, Tom said. They try to stay topical, mix things that might not go with baseball, and take chances. They rely on ideas and creativity, he added, because they don't have the money the big teams do.
