CLASSIFICATION: Dr. Carol Nelson talked about her and her family's wide variety of medically related COVID experiences. She was in Sierra Leone in January and heard the first rumblings about this new disease while there. Eventually the country shut down and in May a doctor she knew died from the disease. She took her first cruise ever in January as COVID was ramping up. She also started work as a travel physician which ended abruptly because of the disease. Husband Keith works for Hennepin County in HIV care. One son is an ICU nurse at HCMC caring for COVID patients and is many times the last one to be with those who die. She advised if you would rather not get the disease, wear masks, stay 6 ft. away from people, and wash your hands. You DO NOT want to be intubated! She also has a son that performing residency at HCMC. Another son is a social worker that has begun to work remotely because of COVID. Carol has a sister in Billings, MT where the hospital she works in has been inundated by COVID patients. She has a sister in Helena, MT who is a clinical scientist doing COVID tests non-stop. She recommends the MN Dept. of Health website to stay current on COVID. Flattening the curve in MN worked and now is not the time to be lax about your attitude on the disease. Carol uses the Rotary Nature Preserve for socially distanced exercise.

Program: John Hinderaker: Minnesota: "Should I Stay or Should I Go"

Rebekah Hagstrom introduced John Hinderaker who runs the Center of the American Experiment, a conservative think tank based in MN. John has been a litigator for 41 years and has participated in 100 jury trials. He is a guest and host for various national and local media programs.

John started by noting that there is a projected \$44.7 billion shortfall in state revenue due to the COVID virus. Legislators are pushing for substantial increases in revenue. We have choices if we want to balance the budget, raise revenue or cut spending or a combination of both.

According to John, MN is the 5th highest ranked in the US for personal income tax rate and high taxes hamper economic growth. Our state's job growth is slower than the US average and MN is below US averages in GDP growth from 2001 to 2018. The question he raised is, "should you stay in MN or move to avoid high state taxes?" It seems that those with higher net worth are part of a trend that is resulting in net outflow/ migration out of the state for the most recent eight-year period on record. According to John, MN is a net gainer of lower income people and net loser in every income bracket over \$50k/year. People seem to be leaving the state due to high taxes and he says many people never even make it to MN because of the state's low rate of job creation, which is also below the national average. John says we could get closer to a balanced state budget if returned to spending rates we had in 2016-17. According to John, education and welfare programs are the top two categories of expenditures. He says our welfare spending per person in poverty is the 3rd highest in the nation at \$30k/person not counting federal welfare programs and we could cut welfare spending back to US averages and that would help balance the state budget. But job creation and economic growth have to be higher too.
