Conrad and his wife, Mary, have lived on Bald Eagle Lake for 50 years. He and Mary have three kids (Ryan, Sally and Paul), and several grandchildren (including two Eagle Scouts).

Conrad attended South Dakota State University (SDSU) and earned a degree in mechanical engineering in 1958. Two of his grandsons attend SDSU -- one just graduated in mechanical engineering and the other is trying to find his way while playing football and lifting weights.

"I was told once you pass 80 to write everything down so you don't forget anything," Conrad said, referring to his notes for the classification, "but now I can't read my writing."
