PROGRAM: Ann Frisch: Nuclear Weapons Abolition

Our own Ann Frisch gave an excellent program concerning the threat of nuclear weapons and the most recent United Nations treaty to prohibit nuclear weapons. In the 1960s there were 5 countries which had nuclear weapons: USA, United Kingdom, France, Russia and China. Now, North Korea, Israel, Pakistan and India have nuclear weapons. It is estimated that there are now 15,000 nuclear weapons. On July 17, 2017, the United Nations adopted the Treaty on Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW). According to Ann and Wikepedia "for those nations that are party to it, the treaty prohibits the development, testing, production, stockpiling, stationing, transfer, use and threat of use of nuclear weapons, as well as assistance and encouragement to the prohibited activities. For nuclear armed states joining the treaty, it provides for a time-bound framework for negotiations leading to the verified and irreversible elimination of its nuclear weapons program." Upon ratification by 50 countries each country signing the treaty is bound by it. To date, 35 countries have signed. A video was shown concerning the effect a nuclear explosion would have on a major city, its inhabitants and the surrounding area. 
