### **Program:** YMCA Update

Gene Altstatt shared his Y journey from dances as a young man to becoming a contributor and board member. He presented three Y leaders who gave an update on Maplewood (formerly Maplewood Community Center) and White Bear Lake Area YMCAs.

Linda Clausen, the branch director at the White Bear Y, shared a story about a member who made a resolution to lose weight. A few weeks into dieting, she decided to join a gym - the Y. She worked out, then met with a trainer to make improvements including looking at her diet and nutrition. She has made a remarkable turnaround losing 73 pounds so far. Her walks home from the gym used to take two hours and now take just 32 minutes.

**Kristin Reither**, who works mostly at Maplewood, shared information about a community garden at the WB Y. The garden has grown to 25 plots and they are rented by individual members (on sale now) and used in youth programming (kids learn about gardening, food, etc.).

Safety around the water is important at the Y. One program, teaching kids what to do if they fall in the water, serves over 500 kids in WB and Maplewood schools (swim suits provided if needed). At WB, a grade level visits the Y from each elementary school. Another water safety focus is providing lifeguards (now hiring) at three community beaches (two on WBL and Silver Beach).

The Y partnered with the City of Maplewood (started Spring, 2015) to operate the former community center. They put \$1.5 million into the facility adding banquet space, expanding the fitness center and studio spaces, updating equipment and family locker rooms. They also added a child care space that is kid-friendly and includes an indoor play structure. Future renovations include the outdoor space this spring followed by locker rooms and third floor improvements.

Y Executive Director **Shane Hoefer** said the Maplewood Y has grown so much it now has its own charter and will soon have its own board (instead of a shared board with White Bear). The Y is open to new board members and Rotarians were invited to consider this opportunity.

Shane said they are having conversations regarding the need for lifeguards at Memorial Beach. He discussed the Youth in Government program that includes a delegation from the WB area.

Finally he thanked Rotary members individually and as a group for supporting Y Partners, which provides scholarships to needy families. The contribution from the club is provided through the Community Service Team.
