PROGRAM: Bob Gehrke presents Lue Her, "Otto Bremer Trust"

Lue is seasoned non-profit professional and in addition to his work with the Otto Bremer Trust, he has been a Bush Foundation Fellow. Lue got to know Jeff Otto from our club and has worked with Bill Foussard on Twin City philanthropic endeavors. In 1886, Otto Bremer came to Aberdeen, SD from Germany. From there he made his way to St. Paul, where he grew up, starting his working life as worker in a local hardware store then on to bookkeeping at German American Bank which later became American Bank. With his brother Adoph, he became a partner in the Schmidt Brewery. The Otto Bremer Trust was created by Bremer in 1944, putting \$100,000 to work for various causes to start. They granted about \$50 million in 2018. The Trust owns 92% of the Bremer Bank operation which is most prevalent in rural areas. Lue spends a lot time in these rural areas. The Trust operates in MN, ND, and WI primarily. According to Lue, conversations are the main connector of the Trust to the places and people they work with. Philanthropy to affect change is the main purpose of their gifts as opposed to benevolent giving. Their process after receiving an application includes discernment of how a grant will change a particular situation. They also assess whether or not the organization has good management and stewardship. The Trust does not favor giving to causes when tax dollars are already a big part of the equation. Examples of grant recipients include hospitals, catastrophe situations, adoptions, foster care, arts, civic groups, youth, Red Cross, and emergency vehicles in rural areas. Lue said he loves the giving and humorous nature of Rotarians in various clubs he has visited.


