Today's Private Detective

Rick's background includes work with the FBI and work for a private company, Waypoint in WBL, in forensic investigations. He discussed the risks and impact of economic crime. Accounting and audit firm Price Waterhouse Coopers in their annual survey this year found that half of all businesses in the US have been affected by economic fraud, with \$42 billion in reported losses. This includes customers, cybercrime, asset misappropriation, bribery, and corruption. External accounts for 39%, internal 37%, and collusion of external and internal 20%. In the COVID era there is a big impact on the SBA with fraudulent requests in the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and the Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program (EIDLP). There are many instances of stolen identity, false information, multiple disaster loans for the same company, and foreign entities receiving payments and loans. Fraud is alive and well in MN and not just PPP loans. Unemployment insurance fraud is getting more attention. Using information stolen from the dark web, cold calling email phishing, data theft, and public websites, fraudsters are selling counterfeit PPE, work from home money laundering schemes, and overpriced healthcare related products. Business emails are being compromised and respondents are pressured into doing something quickly, such as helping someone in distress by sending money. There has been \$3 trillion in US government COVID aid so far and estimates are that 5% to 10% of that money has been lost to fraud or abuse. This amounts to \$150 to \$300 billion lost.
