Curt Akenson gave an update on our club's part of the successful Share the Love event that raised money for the Rotary International Foundation. So far this year we have given \$27,500 which projects to our best year ever. Curt thanked everyone for giving and announced that Bill Rust earned his 9th Paul Harris award, Pam Bowers earned her 5th, Pam Tschida earned her 4th, and finally he thanked Jim Hunt for making a very significant contribution to the RI Foundation this year.

Bob Timmons announced the Taste of White Bear Lake planning is well underway. **Darrell Stone** reported on the sponsorship team activities. This year, there will be only one premier sponsor (\$5000); \$2500-gold; \$1000-silver; \$500-bronze; \$250-Rotary.

CLASSIFICATION TIME: Kevin Donovan used his classification to highlight the Equity and Inclusion Team. Kevin co-leads this team with Jackie Reis. This is an official avenue of Rotary service now since the killing of George Floyd. About 20 people have been involved over the past year. Kevin interviewed Steve Griffith, Ellen Hiniker, and Ken Galloway about their involvement. Steve says he is now more fully aware of his privilege, with clarity coming from participating in the book club, Living Room Conversations (LRCs), and team meetings. Ellen, coming from her position of leadership as city manager in WBL, mentioned that silence sends a message and sees the city's role as one that can leverage data they have access to. City data should be used to affect residents lives in meaningful ways pertaining the equity and inclusion. Ken has learned a lot by his participation in the book club, LRCs. He sees inequality and injustice as one of the biggest problems in our world and sees Rotary having a natural fit for helping be part of the solution.

Merchant Minute: John Lupo, President of Grandma's Bakery-John is a Certified Master Baker and he talked about the effect of COVID-19 on his business. His business has suffered mightily from the pandemic especially segments that depend on airline, airport, corporate and catering. The storefronts are doing better than ever. The big box operations are doing well, but his operation has suffered 40% loss in revenue in the past year. Lately profits are up 14% but the business is still in rough shape. The PPP government stimulus saved him, now he just hopes Grandma's will survive. John has noticed a toll on his own and his employees' mental health and all of us. His message: Shop local-it helps!

Program: Ken Baltzer presents: Guy Bosch, Warden at Stillwater Prison Guy started out as a corrections officer in 1989 and has been part of the Minnesota Department of Corrections in many functions over the past 32 years. With many changes occurring over years, he has seen many successes and some failures in the corrections system. The current mission of the MN Dept. of Corrections is to transform lives with an emphasis on human dignity, respect, safety, and security. He is the 20th warden of the prison since its inception in 1914. He oversees a budget of \$49 million. About 25% of prisoners have jobs while serving their sentences. The prison serves 1.305 men, down from 1.600 pre-COVID. Instead calling them inmates or offenders, prisoners are simply referred to as men. The larger demographic blocks break down as follows: 50% black, 39% white, and 9% native American. The prison can house level 4 security prisoners. The facility was COVID-free until last fall, but in October 950 men and 150 staff got the virus. Minnesota has gone from 10,000 to 7,500 prisoners due to criminal justice reform and COVID. Just as a note, MN has one of the lowest incarceration rates in the nation. There are an average of 15 assaults per month between prisoners and staff. In order not to keep a healthy perspective. Guy says it helps to have a guiet ride home from Stillwater to Lakeville and to try not to dwell on the tough days.
