Elections for club posts will happen in December.


CLASSIFICATON: BOB MORSE

PROGRAM: Brian Robinson, on the state of manufacturing

Brian is chief executive at Wilson Tool, a tool and dye manufacturer based in Hugo. Wilson has 800 employees across 18 facilities all told, with 440 in Hugo.

It's been a challenge during the pandemic, Brian said. Wilson mainly does the punches for sheet metal fabrication industry. The business has been flat to declining, so Wilson is diversifying to tools that create pill bottles, and work that supports the ammo industry, small battery industry, and LED lighting.

A unique thing: Wilson owns and operates eight golf courses in Midwest and Colorado. The purchases were part of an estate planning by original owner.

State of manufacturing:

-The country has experienced recessions every eight to 10 years, declines of 25-30 percent (revenue, staff cuts). 2019 was beginning of most recent.

-Bright side of the troubles is that they have helped the realization and importance of making products in the U.S. "Manufacturing is coming back to the U.S.," he said. Wilson is back to 2019 levels.

-Strength here is measured using Purchasing Managers Index ... a scale that shows whether manufacturing is expanding or contracting. Above 50 is expansion, below 50 is contracting. Most of 2021 has been about 60.

-One sign of strength is ability to export. Wilson closed China facility but still has sent about 10% out to other countries to continue product development. Foreign competition:

-Countries like Brazil and China charge manufacturers 30-60 percent tariffs to export its products into their countries.

-Many don't have same safety, environmental standards to the level of the U.S. -Still most countries are making investments in latest technology Issues:

-Labor shortage, skilled and unskilled. Wilson has worked with high schools to reinstate some of the trades within schools. There is a need in plumbing, electrical and on. Avg wage at Wilson is \$33 per hour.

-Health care increases

-Covid and lost productivity. He said they've had 23 cases in November. Wilson has been short-staffed, and the pandemic worsened the condition.

-Still, more work than Wilson can handle. Seems to be tolerance among customers. Wilson fits into this narrative, too: U.S. is the second most-efficient manufacturer in the world ... more done here with technology, whereas in China it's based on human labor. *Writer of the week: Bob Timmons*
