PROGRAM FROM MEETING OF 3/16/22:

Jim Rathburn introduced Mike Miner and Kelley Skumautz to present today's program to familiarize our members with PAI, a nonprofit organization assisting adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities based in White Bear Lake. Mike serves as its President and Kelley serves as its Development and Communication Manager. Mike listed several daily activities, performed by most adults including eating, exercising, shopping, learning and working but explained the individuals served by PAI are not able to perform many of these tasks without training and assistance. Through its four locations in White Bear Lake PAI performs day activities and employment services including job coaching, vocational and life skill development, independence, medication administration and interpersonal skills.

Kelley described PAI programs including its Community Arts Initiative, job coaching including trial runs, job tryouts and vocational skills. They work with schools, families, guardians and caseworkers. Many of their services are assisted by volunteers. Day activities and individualized training are performed by skilled staff and much of PAI revenue is provided through Medicaid, families and contributions. Volunteers are needed or outdoor activities and special events. In addition to charitable contributions PAI seeks donations of activity supplies.
