CLASSIFICATION: Art Hancock, Rector (senior pastor) at St. John in the Wilderness Episcopal Church in downtown WBL

Art has been a WB Rotarian for about 2 years and noted that it is great to be at a live meeting! He is from Nashville, TN where his father worked at the Jack Daniels Distillery. By coincidence, Art and fellow Rotarian and pastor here in town, Bill Eaves, attended the same college in Tennessee. Art came back from a mission and was called to the clergy, with placements in three southern congregations before his call to northern Wisconsin. He and his wife also ran a wilderness camp in northern Wisconsin and they still have a cabin in the Cable area. They have six children ages 19-24. He loves the outdoors and is happiest canoeing, kayaking, or paddleboarding. St. John in the Wilderness is the longest running congregation in WBL and the original location was near the Episcopal cemetery here in town. The church is now located on Clark St. downtown. Although every day is different, the hard but rewarding work of being a pastor includes helping his parishioners recognize marriages, births and deaths, preaching, and teaching. COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM MEETING will be held Wednesday June 23, at noon, via Zoom.

Jim Hunt announced: Rancho Quemado Water Project Reaches **Completion.** The White Bear lead District Grant project to provide water storage and distribution to this small village on the Osa Peninsula in far SW Costa Rica is finished. The \$16,000 grant provided two-22,000 liter tanks and two distribution lines. This provided water to 90 families, for many the first running water in their homes, along with several community buildings. Thanks goes out to White Bear and the other four district clubs that supported this project.

PROGRAM: Pam Tschida presents Rick Heidick, Fast For Hope Fast For Hope (FFH) is an initiative of Rotary District 5960 that uses club donations equal to the cost of one meeting meal (\$10) per year from each club member to fund needs in a few communities in Nicaragua. The program has been in place for 14 years and uses little or no RI Foundation grant money, just member donations. The FFH model helps with community needs, but also tries to promote local community ownership, projects with an ongoing term. With the goal of sustainable cooperation and local ownership of solutions, the FFH team must move at the pace dictated by the Nicaraguan communities to be successful. Because poverty and lack of resources are the problems and because Nicaraguan national and local governments do not support the people very well, FFH is partnering with Opportunity International (OI). OI is trying to overcome similar problems in 23 countries as well as 30 communities in Nicaragua. Right now, FFH and OI, with assistance from the Kairos nongovernmental organization, are working on agueduct and water improvements with the local people. The people need better access to clean water. El Corozo is a town of 120 households and 400 people. The closest well is five kilometers away and because it is shut off in the dry season (six months per year) at that time the only water comes when a tanker truck shows up at very inconsistent intervals. FFH is helping the local people with the whole water governance process: getting local buy-in for raising money for wells, maintaining the system, keeping the source water clean, and having community ownership. The community of El Comejen is in need of help with electrification and lighting of a two kilometer public road and FFH is using the same process of working with the local people there too. At 100 members, our club gives \$1,000 per year to the FFH efforts. Rick has been to Nicaragua six times as part of the FFH team and invited club members to join the District 5960 FFH steering team.
