PROGRAM FROM MEETING OF 7/27/22:

Hockey Day Minnesota (Greg Bartz, Corey Roberts, Nick Guzzo and Jon Anderson)

Hockey Day Minnesota will take place in White Bear Township on January 28, 2023 at the Polar Lakes Park. This week-long event will require the participation of many volunteers and much community support. Last year's event was in Mankato and the torch was passed to WBL. A 501(c)3 nonprofit has been set up for the event. Twin Cities Ortho has the naming rights at the \$150,000 sponsorship level. Many other sponsors are being recruited.

The \$2 Million event was announced with a float at Manitou Days and special announcement at Marketfest two weeks ago. A concert was held at Big Wood on July 17 with 700 people attending. Big Wood has released a beer for the event called "Hip-Check-IPA."

For the event, a hockey rink will be built from scratch, starting with sand to level the field for the ice, installing refrigeration, with 2 inches of ice and lighting. Snow removal will require many volunteers (ice scrapers). An 18,000 square foot entertainment tent will be set up for Thursday through Sunday for music and the arts. The old Zamboni from the Minnesota Hockey Museum will be on display.

Multiple hockey games will be played including girls and boys high school hockey, White Bear alumni, and game between St. John's and Augsburg.

What is Hockey Day Minnesota: an annual event in Minnesota run in cooperation with the Minnesota Wild and Bally Sports North that celebrates the sport of hockey throughout the state. Now a multi-day showcase, the event is held in mid-to-late January or early February and typically consists of multiple high school games (a mixture of boys and girls), a men's and/or women's college hockey game, and concludes with a Minnesota Wild NHL game. With some games now taking place on Thursday and Friday, the main set of games are played on a Saturday and are broadcast on FSN. Most of the games are played at a featured outdoor location with a rink built specifically for the event. However, some of the college matchups are played in standard home arenas and all of the Wild games are played in a NHL venue (usually the Xcel Energy Center).
