MERCHANT MINUTE:

Jim Rathburn introduced Keith and Connor Dehnert to speak about their family business' Talley's and Two Silo **Winery.** Keith and his wife Jan purchased Tally's in 1990. The boat livery business has grown to a restaurant/bar and entertainment and rental business featuring pontoons, fishing boats, canoes and other watercraft. In 2017 they purchased a tract of land in Grant and started "Two Silo Winery". Connor explained they have studied work at the University in it's development of hearty grape stocks which are suitable for the MN climate. In 2019 they had their first planting of 2300 grape vines. As the plants develop they are preparing their buildings and equipment and are 8 to 12 months from production. Good luck in your new venture guys and thanks for bringing the story Jim.

PROGRAM FROM MEETING OF 8/24/22 :

Nora Slawick introduced Mike Wilhelmi, Customer Relations Manager for approximately 50 communities in the northeast metro area for Xcel Energy. Mike began his presentation by explaining that in addition to its core function of serving customers with natural gas and electricity, Xcel spends a great deal of resources preparing for the future. The company currently has approximately 3.7 million electric and 2.1 million natural gas customers overall. In MN the count is 1.3 million electric customers and 472 natural gas customers. The company has a goal of producing energy carbon free by 2050 and reach 80% of that goal by 2030. It plans to close its coal fired plants (Currently able to produce 2500 MW) in MN by 2030 and by 2034 reach production of 5800 MW of electricity through renewable sources. This will include shutdown of production at the Steven King plant on the St. Croix in approximately five years. That plant at peak can burn nearly three coal cars per hour. Large substation, distribution operations will continue at the site and a substantial Photovoltaic array will be built at the site.

Mike explained that while it produces less than coal, natural gas will always be a source of carbon emissions although Xcel is seeking means of reducing methane content in the gas. It is also planning to assist in powering 1.5 million electric vehicles by 2030 including transportation corridor public charging stations and at-home charging stations which will require approval from the MN Public Utility Commission.

In response to questions Mike stated that Xcel believes it has and will have sufficient energy sources now and in the future and that its distribution grid is sufficient to meet demand. However, as coal fired plants are shutdown and replaced by multiple solar and wind generation additional transmission lines will be needed. Xcel has no current plans for additional nuclear generation sites but intends to continue operation of its current plants as long as possible and allowed.
