Matt works in media and communication and has produced PBS documentaries. He volunteers as an advocate for access to government information. Our state has an open records law with various acts and statutes promoting access to information. Included are the following:

Freedom of Information Act

MN Government Data Practices Act

Official Records Act

Records Management Statute

These acts and statutes were put in place in the 1960s and 1970s. St. Paul Pioneer Press editor, John Finnegan Sr. helped get the Minnesota Data Practices Act passed for both public and non-public information. Some of the topics that Matt's group has been procuring access to information about includes government uses of technology, like the border patrol using drones to monitor our border with Canada and commercial use of drones also. His organization made requests about public spending regarding US Bank Stadium and public money used for the 2018 Super Bowl. They simply help the residents of the state know government policies, how they are decided and how they are funded. Matt's organization has been behind lawsuits for acquiring information about the US Department of Justice policies during the Trump administration and state documents regarding the Dayton administration's courting Amazon to build a corporate headquarters in our state.
