He extended his sincere thanks to all members who helped to make the event a success and called out several for their extra efforts including John Jacobson (Pine Tree Orchard), Ken Galloway (Food), Eric Hendrickson (Adult Beverages), Pat McFarlane (Tickets), Darrell Stone (Špońsors), Jennifer Breon (Graphics Design), Dale Grambush (Multi Media), Bill Rust and Ken Baltzer (set-up and equipment). Program: Chuck Sandstrom introduced club member Carol Nelson to describe the work and achievements of the Rural Health Care Initiative in Sierra Leone. Carol was raised in northwest North Dakota and earned her undergraduate degree for Concordia College in Morehead and then graduated form the medical school of the University of North Dakota and served her residency at Washington University. She worked as an MD for 37 years with Health Partners, U of M (Boynton Health Center) and HCMC. Carol and her husband Keith have three adult sons. In 2013 Carol joined the Board of Directors of the newly formed RHCI and until recently served as its volunteer Executive Director.

The RHCI was founded through the vision of Alice Karpeh a nurse whom Carol met at the Boynton Center. She came to MN after her husband was assassinated in Sierra Leone and aspired to return there to help fill vital health care needs. The program primarily serves women and children in the rural Tikonko Chiefdom (a sociopolitical district) of Sierra Leone and its primary focus is Healthcare access, Birth Waiting Homes, Children's Health, Food Security and Agriculture. Sierra Leone was a British colony until its independence in 1961 followed by a 10-year civil war beginning in 1992 and a devastating Ebola epidemic from 2014-2015 both of which crippled the country's infrastructure and economy and contributed to its high infant and maternal mortality rates. Through its Birth Waiting Houses pregnant and postpartum women receive medical monitoring, health education and care and since formed there have been no maternal deaths among the more than 650 mothers served. The program also serves rural healthcare needs through mobile outreach clinics via motorbikes and by partnering with government clinics over 23,000 residents are served. The Children's Health service concentrates on nutrition, therapeutic care and transportation. The Food Security and Agriculture component of RHCI services include educational support through an area university and on-site gardens and orchards near the Birth Waiting Houses.
